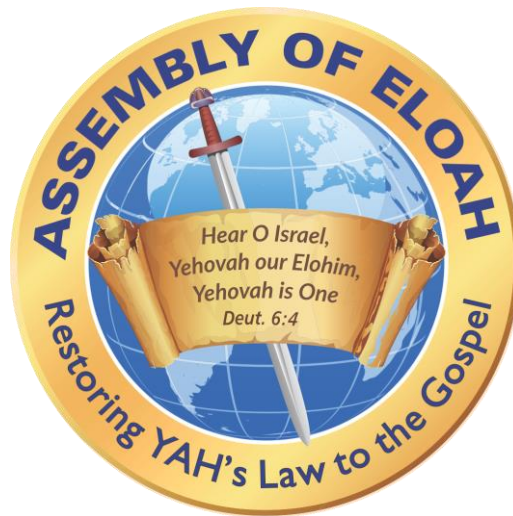
Survival Items that You May Need in a Crisis

Brethren, all of us should be aware that certain foods and necessary articles will disappear if or when a loss of power or transportation and delivery difficulties commence. The average city has five days of food on hand for its population.

Formerly farming communities had one to two years of food on hand for their families and North America had ten years of stored grains on hand. Now, it is against the U.S. law to have more than three months food stored.

In Niagara Falls during Tabernacles in 1989 it was apparent that the majority of attendees still held to the Israelite slave mentality (Nehemiah 9:17). That is, require others to care for them but do as little as possible for themselves and complain non stop. A similar list was available for all attendees. This list was also supplied at Tabernacles 2005 and everyone should have most of these items stored by now.

2. Cleaning

Anti-bacterial soaps and detergents
Baby wipes & supplies, disposable and lots of fabric diapers, oils, waterless & Anti-bacterial soap
Men's & Women's hygiene: shampoo, toothbrush & paste, mouthwash, floss, shaving supplies, haircare, skin products, tampons, nail clippers, files
Plain bleach, variety of soaps,
Portable toilets
Toilet paper, Kleenex, paper towels, hand and body towels, sponges,
Washboards, mops, buckets w/wringer

3. Clothes

Clothes line with pins and hangers, variety of soaps and learn to make it
Hats & neckerchiefs, wollens, jackets, long johns, gloves
Rain gear, rubber boots, hats, etc.
Variety of cases
Work boots, sneakers, laces, belts, durable shirts and pants. Lots of underwear and socks

4. Cooking

Cast iron cookware
Cookstoves like Propane, Coleman or Kerosene with fuel, wicks, mantles
Coleman Fuel, Coleman's Pump Repair Kit: 1(800) 835-3278
Cooking oils like olive, sunflower, corn etc.
Clear lamp oil, lamps, wicks, hangers
Matches, lighters
Manual can openers & hand egg beaters, whisks and all kitchen tools
Manual grain grinder

5. Food & Shelter

Candles, oil lamps, cooking oil,

Canned fruits, veggies, soups, stews
Charcoal & lighter fluid
Coffee, tea, powered bouillon, soups, stews, gravy, vinegar,
Dog & cat food
Dried rice, beans, pasta, lentils, peas
Fish oil, whole wheat flour,
Fire wood (dry),
Garden seeds, open pollinated and non-hybrid
Garden tools & supplies
Graham crackers, trail mix, jerky
Honey, syrups, white & brown sugar,
Instant foods, kitchen utensils
Milk – Powdered, condensed and some calf or dog milk replacer
Peanut butter, popcorn, nuts,
Spices, vinegar, olive oil, baking supplies, salt & pepper,
Water containers
Water filters or purifiers, flavoring
Whole grains like wheat, barley, oats,

6. Medicine

Antihistamine, antiseptics, Band-aids, disinfectants, eye, ear & nose drops, Epsom salts, hand sanitizer, head, tooth & stomach ache pain killers, healing ointments, hydrogen peroxide, laxative & diarrhea, red wine, hard liquor, supplements, Terramycin, vitamins

7. Tools & Equipment

Aluminum foil, regular & heavy duty
Fire extinguishers, boxes of baking soda
Backpacks & duffle bags
Duct, masking and other tape
Files, hammers, hatchets, axes
First aid kits, large and small
Garbage bags
Gasoline containers (Plastic or Metal)
Guns, ammunition, pepper spray, clubs, bats & slingshots
